How to play Roulette

When prompted, you will be able to place all your chosen bets for the next round of Roulette. After you have placed your bets, the Roulette table will display up to 10 of the highest possible pay-outs that can be awarded, based on the numbers you have chosen.

During play, the results column will also show a history of the most recent winning numbers, while 'Hot' and 'Cold' numbers (those drawn frequently and infrequently, respectively) will be noted, as well as a red/black and odd/even result ratio.

The above results cannot be used to predict future results, but provide information of past games which may or may not affect your choices.

You can also play Roulette and Blackjack games on your iOS or Android device, using the Mobile app.

Roulette Guide

For centuries Roulette has offered casino players the glamour and excitement that Las Vegas offers today with a simple spin of the wheel. A relatively simple game to understand, it features in all online casinos or land-based casinos, and here is our guide to Roulette.

Roulette in French means 'little wheel' and before you get started it's important to understand the anatomy of the Roulette wheel and table. The wheel has 37 numbers, 0-36. In American Roulette there are 38 numbers, 0-36 and then a 00 slot as well.

Before the ball hits the wheel, you must make a bet on the table. There are numerous bets you can make in Roulette and all bets placed are final once the ball hits the wheel.

Once the wheel stops and the ball lands on a number pocket, the croupier will pay out the players on the table who chose the correct number at the correct odds. After this, another round will begin and the game continues the same each round.

Types of Bets

In Roulette there are numerous bets you can make. You're not restricted to making one kind of bet as in many other table games.

Straight Up – A single bet on any number on the Roulette table.

Split – Bet on two numbers simultaneously. Place your chip in-between two numbers and if the ball lands on either number, you win at odds of 17:1.

Street – A street bet is when you bet on three numbers simultaneously that all appear in a row on the grid of numbers on the Roulette table. Winning Street bets pay out 11:1.

Corner – Also known as a Square or Box of Four bet, this is a bet placed on a block of four numbers on the grid. You must place your chip at the meeting point of all four numbers for the bet to be valid. Winning bets pay out at 8:1.

Six Line – in a nutshell this is two Street bets combined. A Six Line bet is a bet on two adjoined streets. Bets can be made by placing your chips at the intersection of two streets and the odds are 5:1.

Five Number – Or a Basket Bet, can only be played in American Roulette. A bet that's rarely made but involves a bet placed on both zero pockets (0, 00) and 1, 2 and 3. Your chip must be placed on the edge of the adjoining line between the zero pockets and the 1, 2 and 3.

Neighbour Bet – placing a bet on five numbers all next to each other on the wheel rather than on the table, e.g. 15, 34, 22, 5 and 17. This is better known as a 22 Neighbour Bet in American Roulette.

First 12 – a bet that covers the first dozen numbers on the Roulette table (1-12). This bet can be placed on the '1st 12' section of the table.

Second 12 - a bet that covers the second 12 numbers on the Roulette table (13-24). This bet can be placed on the '2nd 12' section of the table.

Third 12 - a bet that covers the third 12 numbers on the Roulette table (25-36). This bet can be placed on the '3rd 12' section of the table.

1-18 - As it says, this is a bet placed on numbers 1 to 18 using the designated section on the Roulette table.

19-36 - As it says, this is a bet placed on numbers 19 to 36 using the designated section on the Roulette table.

Even - Bets placed on all even numbers on the table. The 'Even' section is placed next to the 'Red' section on the table.

Odd - Bets placed on all odd numbers on the table. The 'Odd' section is placed next to the 'Black' section on the table.

Black – Bets placed on only the black numbers on the table. You can make this bet by placing chips in the 'Black' designated area of the table.

Red - Bets placed on only the red numbers on the table. You can make this bet by placing chips in the 'Red' designated area of the table.

Roulette Rules

Roulette has been played in one form or another for centuries. The iconic wheel is thought to have once contained as few as 31 numbers, though it now typically has either 37 (in Europe) or 38 (in the United States), meaning the odds of success vary slightly depending on which variant you are playing. The game's evolution has seen it become a staple of modern casinos the world over.

Overview

The wheel in European Roulette contains 37 pockets, numbered zero to 36. This means players are offered better odds than at other roulette tables, such as American, that have more pockets.

The two main sections of the table on which wagers are placed are the 'inside section' and 'outside section'. Each contains many different ways to bet.

The inside section offers bets on individual numbers that are close to one another on the table layout, or groups of up to six numbers.

The outside section contains pairs of bets for red or black, high or low and odd or even (each covering 18 numbers). You can also make six different 12-number bets (three each of wagers known as 'Column' and 'Dozen' bets).

In addition, there are groups of bets that comprise seven to 17 numbers, located on different segments of the wheel. These wagers can be placed with one easy click on the 'racetrack', the part of the roulette table layout that resembles the actual wheel and the order in which the numbers are displayed, rather than the numerical order of the main betting layout.

Game Play and Game Rules

Upon joining the table, each player is required to select a chip color to use for the duration of their session. You can then easily select the value of chips to be used when placing your bets, and vary the number placed at one time on a given bet area.

We automatically keep track of amounts wagered, and will not allow bets under the table minimum to be placed. If your selected denomination is lower than the minimum allowed, your first click on that betting area will place the table minimum bet.

Using inside or outside bets, you can wager on any number, or combination of numbers. Remember that each outside bet must be at least the amount of the table minimum; the same rule applies to the total wagered on inside bets. Remember too that each is independent of the other when it comes to the table minimum.

For winning bets, the original wager is returned to your account, plus the payout you receive based on the amount staked and the odds information listed below. Losing bets will be lost.

The software automatically recognizes that inside bets are cumulative, and so bets can be placed within the inside section of the table until the minimum is reached. If it's not reached, bets under the minimum will be removed when the wheel is spun (after the betting timer expires).

When playing on a Multi-Player table, all bets will be eligible to win or lose once the betting timer expires. On Single Player tables, bets will not be considered active until the action is confirmed and the Spin button has been clicked.

Split and Racetrack Bets

In addition to the Inside and Outside sections, bets can also be placed on the racetrack area of the table. This section of the roulette table layout represents the actual order that the numbers appear on the wheel itself. Click on one of the numbers to place chips there, plus the two adjacent numbers (known as 'neighbors') to either side of that number.

The racetrack can be used to place four other special bets, each of which automatically places multiple chips on the layout, as shown in the following table.

Adjacent two-number bets (splits) of the same color on the main layout (i.e. red or black) can be wagered upon in one action using the controls for split bets found near the racetrack area of the table.

Bet Limits

Game Name: American Roulette

Following a similar convention to most modern casinos around the world, bet limits at roulette tables vary, depending on whether they cover inside or outside bets.

The outside maximum bet displayed at each table shows the largest amount that can be placed on each (or all) outside bet positions. There is no cumulative maximum.

A table's inside maximum bet refers to the amount permitted to be placed on each individual number (or straight-up) bet.

All other types of inside bet (for example split, line, street, etc.) have their own maximum bet amount, relative to the table's straight-up maximum. The general rule is that the more numbers are covered by a bet, the higher the limits. For example, a Straight Up bet covers one number and the maximum bet might be 25 chips. A Split bet covers two numbers and so double the maximum is allowed (50 chips). A Street bet covers three numbers and in this example the maximum bet would be 75 chips, and so on.

At a table with a 25 chip maximum straight-up bet limit, it is possible to place as many as 40 25-chip bets on or around a number located in the middle column of the layout, such as 17 (one straight up (1), four splits (8), one street (3), four corners (16), and two six-line (12) bets), for a total of 1,000 chips.

House Edge

Roulette games have a house edge (calculated as the difference between the true odds and the payout odds) of 2.70%.

American Roulette games have a house edge of 5.26%. The Five Line wager in American Roulette has a house edge of 7.89%.

Saved Bets

On Single Player tables it's possible to save your favorite bets, so you can quickly and conveniently make specific combination bets. Select 'Save Current Bet' to add it to your favorites. You can manage saved bets in the 'My Bets' menu.

Multi-Player Tables

Multi-Player tables offer you and your friends the chance to play together and enjoy the thrill of social gaming. Just like in real life casinos, Multi-Player tables turn online gaming into a fun interactive experience.
